Maj. Gen. Anthony C. Funkhouser assumed command of the Center for Initial Military Training on July 2, 2015. Prior to arrival, he served as the 95<sup>th</sup> Commandant of the United States Army Engineer School where he oversaw the training of approximately 18,000 Soldiers, NCOs, Warrant Officers, and Officers annually with an average daily load of 2,660 in 80 courses.

MG Funkhouser served in a number of senior leadership positions for the Corps of Engineers including Commander, Northwestern Division, Chief, Joint Capabilities Division (J8) on the Joint Staff, Washington D.C; Commander, Afghanistan Engineer District-South (Operation Enduring Freedom); Commander of Southwestern Division, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Dallas, Texas, Commander of the Corps' Tulsa

District office and as Chief of Staff at the U.S. Army Engineer School, Fort Leonard Wood, Mo.

Numerous combat and operational positions of leadership include service as Platoon Leader, Executive Officer and Battalion Logistics Officer, 317th Engineer Battalion (Corps), Eschborn, Germany; Assistant Operations Officer and Assistant Brigade Engineer, 17th Engineer Battalion, 2nd Armored Division, Fort Hood, Texas; Assistant Division Engineer, 1st Cavalry Division (Operation Desert Shield/Desert Storm); Commander, D Company and B Company, 8th Engineer Battalion, 1st Cavalry Division (Operation Intrinsic Action), Fort Hood and Kuwait; Regimental Engineer, 11th Armored Cavalry Regiment, Fort Irwin; Executive Assistant to the Commanding General, III Corps and Fort Hood; Battalion Executive Officer, 91st Engineer Battalion, Fort Hood; Chief of Doctrine, U.S. Army Engineer School, Fort Leonard Wood; and Commander, 5th Engineer Battalion (Corps) (Operation Iraqi Freedom I).

MG Funkhouser earned a bachelor's degree in civil engineering from the U.S. Military Academy and holds a master's degree in engineering management from the University of Missouri-Rolla, and a master's of Strategic Studies from the U.S. Army War College. His military education includes the U.S. Army Command and General Staff College, Advanced Military Studies Program, and the U.S. Army War College. He is a licensed professional engineer in the Commonwealth of Virginia.

His awards and decorations include the Defense Superior Service Medal, Legion of Merit with two oak leaf clusters, Bronze Star Medal with "V" Device and oak leaf cluster, six awards of the Meritorious Service Medal, six awards of the Army Commendation Medal, five awards of the Army Achievement Medal, the Combat Action Badge, and the Joint Staff Identification Badge. He has also been awarded the Silver de Fleury and the Order of Saint Barbara Medallions.
