



U.S. Army Transportation Museum



Operating Hours: 0900 – 1630, Monday – Saturday
Closed Sundays and all Federal Holidays

 All displays are open and we ask that all visitors wear masks and conform to social distancing guidelines.

The story of the Army's Transportation Corps, from horse-drawn wagons of the Revolutionary War to armored vehicles being used today, is told through exhibits, models and dioramas.

The museum's artifact collection numbers just under 7,000 objects, plus another 1,000 exhibit props. The collection includes nearly 100 macro artifacts ranging from planes, helicopters, tugboats, landing craft to trucks, jeeps, hovercraft, experimental vehicles and trains.

Guided tours and programs are available for both military personnel and civilians.

The museum also includes the Delavan C. Clos Auditorium which can be booked free of charge for events. Exhibit spaces and the outdoor areas are also available to be scheduled.

Military Off Limits Establishments



- The safety and security of all service members is a priority. The Joint Armed Forces Disciplinary Control Board (AFDCB) is an investigative committee composed of members from each military service in the Hampton Roads area, as well and civilian advisers, who work with local law enforcement agencies and local businesses to identify conditions which may adversely affect the health, safety, welfare, and discipline of the armed forces. The Board meets quarterly to assess on-going threats to military readiness, or good order and discipline. Military members are prohibited from entering the premises of, and conducting business with off limits establishments.



- Speed limits are 25 mph unless otherwise posted

Weather

RESIDENT

- · All firearms and ammunition will be taken directly from the place of purchase to the on-base residence.
- . If you reside in the barracks, all firearms must be stored in your unit's arms room.

NON RESIDENT

 All firearms and ammunition will be taken directly from the place of purchase (Base Exchange) to the installation exit point; convenience stops are not authorized.

RECREATIONAL

· Personnel transporting firearms on the installation for sporting activities must register their firearms.

REGISTRATION PROCESS

- · Personnel need to enter Building 648 without their firearms in their possession.
- . Inform the individuals at the front desk that you need to register your weapons.
- · The front desk attendant will provide the registration paperwork and instructions to complete the documents.



Stopping for School Buses



- •You must stop for all stopped school buses with flashing red lights and an extended stop sign when you approach from any direction on a public or private road.
- Stop and remain stopped until all lights stop flashing, children are clear and the bus moves again.
- •None of the red cars are able to make a right or left turn at this time either, since the school bus is controlling the intersection.
- Stop and remain stopped until all lights stop flashing, children are clear and the bus moves again.

You must also stop if the bus is loading or unloading children and the signals are stop on.


Shelter In-Place (SIP) Program



- SIP ops are not the same as LOCKDOWN ops
- SIP is short term (1-3 hrs) sheltering due to HAZMAT or Major Accident Hazardous Incident
- Turn off HVAC; seal room
- SIP kit must be in the SIP area, easily accessible, and labeled
- SIP exercises are to be performed annually
- Turn off HVAC and seal room

Natural Disasters



- A natural disaster can strike with little or no warning
- Severe Weather Threats are:
 - Flooding
 - Winter Storms
 - Severe Storms/Tornadoes
 - Hurricanes



- Tornado Warning: Radar indicates tornadic activity and/or a tornado has been spotted
 Giant Voice, Radios, Cable TV Audio Override and Wireless Emergency Alerts
- Take Cover
- Go to the basement if available
- Multi-story buildings, go to an interior small room or hallway on lowest floor as possible
- Go to the center of the building on the lowest level
- Take shelter under sturdy furniture, in a closet, hallway, bathroom, or under a stairwell, stay away from windows






Hurricanes (1 of 3)



- Hurricane Season from 1 June to 30 November
- Hurricane Watch vs. Hurricane Warning
- BEWARE OF THE "STORM SURGE"






Hurricanes (2 of 3)



- If a hurricane is likely to impact your area, you should:
 - Tune in to the local news television or radio station
 - Secure your home
 - Turn off Utilities if instructed to do so
 - Evacuate if directed to by local authorities



- Stay indoors away from windows and glass doors
- Close all interior doors/curtains/blinds
- Take refuge in a small, interior room on the lowest level- lie on the floor under a sturdy object.



- Dumping or pouring of liquids other than drinking water on impervious surfaces.
- Tossing trash and cigarette butts on the ground
- Allowing yard waste to enter storm drains

SPILL REPORTING


- Immediately report ALL spills (no matter how small) to the Fire Department at (757) 878-1008
- Call 911 in case of an emergency (fire, explosion, injury or release into ANY water or drain)
- ALWAYS PROTECT YOURSELF! Safety and protection of life and limb take precedence over environmental protection!
- Stop the spill, if safe to do
- Contain the spill with absorbents (dry sweep), booms & pads
